A student with prior graduate coursework in psychology may ask the Director of the Doctoral program if the student's previous graduate coursework qualifies him or her for transfer of credit for a closely related University of Hartford doctoral course. Up to 30 credits can be transferred into to doctoral program with permission. While transfer of credit will reduce the number of credits needed for the Psy.D. degree, it may or may not reduce the time for completion of the doctoral program, depending on the length of time it takes the student to complete dissertation and internship requirements. In 2010-2011, 2013-2014, 2015-2016, and 2016-2017 a Master degree in psychology reduced the time for completion, in the other academic years it did not.
