About the Fellowship

The Tai Soo Kim Traveling Fellowship, made possible through the generosity of architect Tai Soo Kim, FAIA, supports the travel of a graduating Master of Architecture student (or student team) each year to further their independent study of architecture. Students can travel anywhere they wish. The Fellowship will support travel expenses of up to \$8,000.

Eligibility

Students graduating with a Master of Architecture degree from the University of Hartford are eligible to apply for the Fellowship. Students are eligible only in the academic year in which they graduate, which closes in May. Only one award will be made per academic year.

Selection Process

Those applying for the Fellowship must submit a proposal for architectural travel, including a draft itinerary (with dates, expenses, total cost). The narrative of the proposal for travel should be 300-500 words in length (not including itinerary). The narrative should state how the proposed travel will further the education of the graduate in architecture, including goals of the proposed travel, its contribution to the graduate's growth as an architect, and the social benefits of the study. The submission should contain supporting materials, such as images and maps/diagrams. The application should be a PDF and submitted to Daniel Horowitz, Graduate Program Director (dhorowitz@hartford.edu). The deadline for submission is March 24, 2025. Applications for the Traveling Fellowship are reviewed by the Department of Architecture faculty, which will vote for the winning submission.

Announcements and Obligations

The announcement of the award is scheduled to take place in April. Travel must be completed within 10 months of the date of the announcement. Winners are obligated to make a public presentation to the faculty, students, staff, and guests of the Department of Architecture on their Fellowship Travel within one year of winning the award.
