SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS 2023

Charles DuBose Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1986 by DuBose Associates, Inc. of Hartford, in memory of Charles DuBose, FAIA. Founder and Chairman of DuBose Associates, Inc. Architects, most noted for his design of Constitution Plaza in Hartford.

Students who have completed two years in accredited undergraduate architectural programs or have been accepted into an accredited graduate program are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Preference will be given to students at the University of Pennsylvania, Georgia Institute of Technology, and the Fontainebleau summer program. Students enrolled in a Connecticut based architectural program or are a Connecticut Resident are also eligible.

Suzanne Sheng Memorial Scholarship

In 1997, the Sheng family established a memorial scholarship fund in memory of Suzanne Sheng who was a Connecticut architect working with C. James Lawler, FAIA at the time of her death.

Students who have completed two years in accredited undergraduate architectural programs or have been accepted into an accredited graduate program are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Preference will be given to students in architectural degree programs at Cornell University. Students enrolled in a Connecticut based architectural program or are a Connecticut Resident are also eligible.

Jane & Kevin Roche Scholarship

In 2022 a scholarship fund was established in honor of Jane & Kevin Roche.

The fund was created by the children of Jane and Kevin Roche to celebrate the lives and achievements of their parents.

Students who have completed two years in accredited undergraduate architectural programs or have been accepted into an accredited graduate program are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Preference will be given to students enrolled in a Connecticut based architectural program or are a Connecticut Resident.

Allan Dehar Memorial Scholarship

In 2020 a scholarship fund was established in honor of Allan J. Dehar, FAIA. Allan was a prominent Connecticut architect with a practice in New Haven. For many years, Allan served as the Chair of the Connecticut Architectural Licensing Board and as a regional Director for the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB).

The Dehar Scholarship Fund will focus on students from the Connecticut Vocational/Technical School system and architectural programs at Connecticut Community Colleges.

Hoffmann Diversity Advancement Scholarship

Hoffmann Architects + Engineers, a Connecticut-based architecture and engineering firm specializing in building exteriors, is pleased to offer this scholarship to students from underrepresented racial or ethnic groups who are seeking degrees in architecture or engineering.

The Hoffmann Scholarship is open to students enrolled full-time in an accredited architecture or engineering program who are from a minority racial or ethnic group and are residents or full-time college students in one of the nine Mid-Atlantic and New England states and the District of Columbia that form the core of Hoffmann's practice.

Unique among CAF programs, the Hoffmann Diversity Advancement Scholarship offers award recipients the opportunity for a paid internship in one of the firm's offices.

CAF Scholarships

The CAF offers scholarships funded from the proceeds of our own fundraising efforts and from our generous sponsors. These scholarships are granted to students with the goal of furthering the mission of the Connecticut Architecture Foundation: to raise public awareness and expectations of Architecture and the built environment.
