- Be formally admitted as a matriculated student at the University of Hartford.
- Have completed the 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at <http://fafsa.gov> (School Code: 001422)
- **If selected for verification, all required documents must be submitted and approved prior to aid disbursement.**
- Pursue at least 6 credits over the course of the entire Summer Term. For Pell, you must be an undergraduate student and registered for at least 3 credits. Federal aid used in the summer will reduce Fall/Spring eligibility.
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements for your respective school or college as defined in the University Bulletin.
- To use a PLUS or alternative loan, complete the application online at studentaid.gov or your chosen lender.
- Be aware that funds cannot pay any earlier than 10 days before the start of the term.
- **You must accept your award in self-service.**
- Funds must be requested and accepted prior to the end of the summer semester.
