Open source texts refers to books or materials that are made available with relaxed or non-existent intellectual property and/or copyright restrictions.

A website to help buy and sell used textbooks.

A joint campaign of state Public Interest Research Groups (PIRGs) to make college-level texts more affordable.

For Authors

Creative Commons Licensing www.creativecommons.org
A clear explanation of the various types of CC copyrights, including the legalese, notice tags, and a registry. It also has a directory of available texts and projects.

Wikimedia Commons commons.wikimedia.org
A repository of free content images, sound, and other multimedia files that can be used in online and dead tree books. Many require the product be freely available (share-alike).

Online repository of free educational content under Creative Commons license. Information is organized into modules, some of which have *not* been peer-reviewed.

Free Books 4 Doctors www.freebooks4doctors.com
The full online versions of over 650 medical texts in a number of languages.

Free Curricula Center www.freecurricula.org
The Free Curricula Center serves as a focal point for the development and sharing of university-level textbooks, instructor guides, and other educational materials.

Freeload Press www.freeloadpress.com
Offers free online and low-cost bound copies of textbooks with ancillaries similar to regular publishers by also selling advertising space. Mostly books about business and computer applications.

ManyBooks.Net manybooks.net
A website of free works, it started with posting Project Gutenberg's November 2003 DVD as a base. Includes fiction and short stories.

MIT Open Courseware ocw.mit.edu/OcwWeb/web/home/home/index.htm
Free-to-download course notes, exams, and other resources for 1700 courses from the MIT catalogue. The goal of OCW is to have material for all courses available by the end of 2007.

Full texts of over 1000 books in history, politics, economics, art and humanities.

Open Text Book blog.opentextbook.org
Run by the Open Knowledge Foundation, Open Text Book is a registry of textbooks and text book material that is open in accordance with Open Knowledge Definition.

Their goal is to digitize every book. Over 100,000 titles so far.
